With the depth in our own ranks, and much preparation and education, we have been able to promote from within. We are very happy to have the internal personnel and institutional knowledge available that they bring for the service of our customers.

Over the past 20 years, North Central Public Power District has grown by leaps and bounds. We have grown from 3936 meters in 1999 to 6623 meters in 2019. In the last year alone, we grew by 70 plus irrigation wells. Our board has laid down the policies that allowed us to grow, and Keith provided the work environment for our district to prosper. With all this, we have one more piece that allows our well-oiled machine to keep spinning, our employees. Despite our growth, we have continued to become more efficient. In 1999 we

had 21 employees. Today, in 2019, we have 21 employees.

I have worked here as the Manager of Finance and Administration and now as the General Manager, going on my 25th year. What has amazed me is the ability of our employees, on all levels, to work well together as a team. To attest to this teamwork, office personnel have got up before 4 a.m. in the morning to put together breakfast for our linemen, assisting line personnel from other districts, and crews from other states helping with our storm damage. (because it wasn't), but it was what needed to be done. Our line crews go out in the worst weather to "get the lights back on." Sometimes they are working over 24 hours straight. Through team work and everyday devotion, the men and women employees of this district provide you, our customer, with service and reliability to a very high standard. We will continue the level of service you, as our customer, expect and deserve.

Make-Ahead Chicken Bacon Ranch Pasta

Ingredients

- 1 lb uncooked rotini pasta
- 3 cups shredded rotisserie chicken
- 1 bottle (16 oz) ranch dressing
- 1 cup crisply cooked & crumbled bacon
- 2 cups shredded Italian cheese blend

Directions

Cook and drain pasta as directed on package. In large microwavable bowl, mix pasta and remaining ingredients. Microwave uncovered on High 1 to 2 minutes or until cheese is melted and mixture is hot and steaming.

To freeze: Spray 2 (8-inch) disposable foil cake pans with cooking spray. Cook and drain pasta as directed on package. In large bowl, mix pasta, chicken, dressing and bacon. Divide mixture between pans. Top with cheese. Spray pieces of foil large enough to cover pans with cooking spray. Cover pans with foil, sprayed side down. Place foil-covered pans in gallonsize re-sealable freezer plastic bags, or wrap in double layer of plastic wrap. Label and freeze. To bake: Thaw pan(s) overnight in refrigerator. Heat oven to 350°F. Remove from plastic, and place foil-covered pan(s) on cookie sheet. Bake 40 to 50 minutes or until instant-read thermometer inserted in center of mixture reads 165°F. If baking from frozen, bake 60 to 75 minutes.
