2020 Census Requires District to Change Charter and Subdivisions

Every ten years the federal government is required to

conduct a census of the population in the United States. The new census numbers are used to allocate federal, state, county and local resources and to determine governmental representation. With the changes in some areas of the district due to some population shift and mainly because of the new area served in Plainview, North Central Public Power District (NCPPD) had to adjust and reassign subdivisions. Each subdivision is required to be within a five percent variance in population from one subdivision to another. Considering the low variance required, the board reassigned subdivision seven as it was an at-large position to represent customers residing in Section 33 and the west half of 34 in North Dry Creek including a major portion of Plainview and a portion of Section 4 and 5 north of Highway 13 in South Dry Creek. Subdivision seven is currently represented by the at-large appointed board member James Meuret. His term will end in January of 2023. A candidate from the newly designated subdivision seven will need to run for the board position.

In a special meeting on October 12, 2021, the NCPPD board approved the proposed Charter Amendment #9 to be submitted to the Nebraska Power Review Board for approval. On December 13, 2021, the Nebraska Power Review Board approved the Charter Amendment #9 to modify NCPPD's charter to reflect the changes recommended by the NCPPD board. Please know that these chang-

es are the result of a team of our employees having consultation with the Nebraska Rural Electric Association's statewide attorney and his office, consultation with our engineers at RVW in Columbus, and working with the neighboring districts on the service territory boundaries, so that the board is given the best informa-

Irrigation Facility Charge to be billed in February

Customers with irrigation accounts are reminded that the 2022 annual facility charge will be billed in February. If you are considering changing your load control schedule (i.e. from 3 Day Control to 2 Day Control) or if an account needs to be transferred into someone else's name, please notify our office as new irrigation contracts will need to be completed. Changes in load control

schedules can be made until the close of business March 30, 2022.

Notification Needed of Irrigation Changes

Irrigation customers are reminded if any changes have been made on your irrigation service(s) (replacing on old irrigation system with a new system or replacing an old pump panel with a new one), you need to notify the North Central Public Power District (NCPPD) office. The customer is responsible for making arrangements to have the equipment removed and returned to our office. If the load control equipment is missing when the annual irrigation inspection is done in the spring, the customer will be notified and will be responsible for locating the equipment and returning it to NCPPD or will be billed for the cost of the missing equiment.



tion to make these changes.

Please take a moment to review the new map. Subdivisions two, five and seven are the subdivisions that were changed so all the subdivisions are within a five percent variance in population. Currently between the appointment on our board for subdivision three, the conversion of the at-large for subdivision seven to the new designated area, and the normal term for subdivision four, the 2022 general election will have three board positions on the ballot. Another fact when reviewing the map is that subdivision seven does not include all of the City of Plainview.

A small portion of the western side of Plainview is in subdivision two to meet the requirements of a five percent variance we spoke of earlier. It has been an arduous journey in working over every legal description for the charter boundaries and balancing of all subdivisions but through team work, NCPPD was able to push this project through.

Pre-planning needed for builds Supply Chain Disruptions cause delays in deliveries

Everyone has heard of supply chain delays. North Central Public Power District (NCPPD) Operations Department is aware of the material shortages and delays. To mitigate these problems, we are currently purchasing material for 2023. We have reviewed the material used in 2020 and 2021 and ordered material based on the average of those two years. One example of the problems that exist is a new single-phase underground pad mount transformer has tripled in price and is 52 weeks

from delivery. NCPPD is planning for the unexpected, but delays may happen with any new services going into the fall of 2022. If you are planning a new service, such as a new grain bin or new residential service in the fall of 2022 or the spring of 2023, please call into the Operations Department so we can plan ahead.

NCPPD's Operations Department plans to make all outage and maintenance items a priority. Please stay safe and patient in these everchanging times.

Irrigation Services Available for 2022

Electric irrigation services are cost effective and allow customers more flexibility when managing their farming operation. Currently North Central Public Power District (NCPPD) does not have a waiting list for new irrigation services in 2022. There is a cost comparison program that customers can use to compare the cost difference between electric and all other types of fuel on the NCPPD website http://www.ncppd.com/

index.asp. According to Bill Sheppard, with the USDA Rural Development office in Norfolk, NE, grant money is available for converting to an electric irrigation service for 2022. The grants are up to 25% of the eligible cost of the project. The next deadline for the grant application is March 31, 2022. 

Bacon Cheddar Potato Soup

Ingredients

2 3/2 cups water

1/4 cup butter or margarine

1 tsp salt

¾ cup milk

2 cups instant mashed potatoes

½ lb bacon, cut into small pieces

½ medium yellow onion, finely chopped

¼ teaspoon black pepper

1 carton (32 oz) chicken broth

½ cup shredded Cheddar cheese (2 oz)
Chopped green onion, if desired

Directions

In 2-quart saucepan, heat water, butter and salt to boiling over medium-high heat. Remove from heat. Stir in milk and potatoes (dry) just until moistened. Let stand about 30 seconds or until liquid is absorbed; whip with fork. Set aside. In 6-quart heavy stockpot, cook bacon over medium heat until crisp. Use slotted spoon to transfer bacon to paper towels, leaving drippings in stockpot. Add onion and pepper to stockpot. Cook 4 to 5 minutes or until onions are translucent and lightly browned. Add potatoes and broth to stockpot. Beat with whisk until ingredients are well combined. Continue to cook until heated through. Transfer soup to bowls. Top with bacon, cheese and green onion.
