engaging schools and providing pre-


sentations for their students. As the industry's workers retire, there are many positions available.

With a quick check into Zip Recruiter.com, it shows over 18 jobs for Journeymen Linemen in Nebraska. Nationally, the average Journeyman Lineman earns \$79,979. By pursuing a two-year associates degree and building upon that degree later in their career, those same linemen have opportunities to move up into the management of electric power utilities. Generally, over half of the upper management in this industry started their career as a lineman.

This year, NCPPD was unable to award the Peter E. Thomassen annual scholarship for youth wanting to pursue a degree to become a utility lineman. There were no qualified applicants. An applicant merely needs to reside within NCPPD's service area and be enrolled in a utility line program to qualify for the scholarship.

NCPPD encourages the local youth to pursue careers that enable them to stay in Nebraska. There are many opportunities that provide for a fulfilling and prosperous life in Nebraska. ## **TRAIN OTHERS**

Train anyone working on your farm, including family members and seasonal workers, about electrical hazards.



# **SAFETY FIRST**

Have daily meetings to review the day's work and discuss safety implications. Know and review where the power lines are, the clearance required, and the proper position of extensions as they are transported.



# **WAIT TO UNFOLD**

Remind workers to fold or unfold extensions well into the field, not close to the field's edge where power lines are typically located.



## **USE A SPOTTER**

When working in the vicinity of power lines, always have a spotter on the ground, who can direct you away from power lines or poles if you are getting too close.



# **DO NOT EXIT YOUR CAB**

If your machine or truck makes contact with a power line, pole, or guy wire, you could become electricity's path to ground and become electrocuted if you step out of the cab.



#### **CALL 9-1-1**

Call 9-1-1 to have your electric utility dispatched to deenergize the power source.

# **School Electrical Safety Program**

Every year North Central Public Power District (NCPPD) provides an Electrical Safety Program for the 4th & 5th graders at the local schools. This year Assistant Operations Manager/Safety Director Tim Hoffman and Energy Advisor Linda Sokol went to St. Ludger's, Creighton Elementary, Plainview Elementary, Verdigre Elementary, Summerland Elementary and Niobrara Elementary. The Shocking Truth video was shown followed by a discussion on the dangers of electricity. Students were shown the equipment that the lineman use for safety and even got the chance to see and feel sand that was turned into glass by a live wire. NCPPD has an energized farm

display that shows what could happen if contact is made with an energized power line while flying a kite, climbing a tree or working with large farm equipment. With the energized farm set we can simulate with a hotdog what could happen if someone or something came in contact with an energized power line. It is a real eye opener for the kids when an electrical arc is created using the hotdog as part of the electrical circuit. Hopefully, what the kids learn in this safety program stays with them so if they are ever in a situation where electrical wires are present, they will remember what to or not to do. The students are then given the opportunity to enter a poster into an electrical safety poster contest. Posters will be judged and the winners will receive a \$25 check and be invited to a NCPPD Board of Directors meeting.

# **Broccoli-Bacon Salad**

# **Ingredients**

- ½ cup mayonnaise or salad dressing
- 2 Tbsp sugar
- 2 Tbsp white vinegar
- 5 cups broccoli, cut into flowerets
- ¼ cup chopped red onion
- ¼ cup chopped yellow onion
- ¼ cup sunflower nuts
- 6 slices bacon, crisply cooked and crumbled

## **Directions**

Mix mayonnaise, sugar and vinegar in large bowl. Stir in broccoli and onion; toss until coated. Cover and refrigerate 2 hours to blend flavors. Sprinkle with nuts and bacon before serving.

# Cheesy Green Bean Casserole

## **Ingredients**

- 1 can condensed cream of mushroom soup
- 1 cup shredded Cheddar cheese blend
- 1 tsp soy sauce
- 1 bag (12 oz) frozen cut green beans, thawed, drained
- 1 small red bell pepper, chopped (1/2 cup)
- 1 ½ cups cheddar crispy fried onions (from 6-oz can)

#### **Directions**

Heat oven to 350°F. In 1 ½-quart casserole, stir together soup, cheese blend and soy sauce. Stir in green beans, bell pepper and 1 cup of the onions. Cover; bake about 30 minutes or until beans are tender and mixture is heated through. Stir; top with remaining ½ cup onions. Bake uncovered about 5 minutes longer or until onions are brown and crisp.

# Summer Rates Start June 1st

The summer electric rate schedule for North Central Public Power District (NCPPD) will go into effect on June 1, 2022. These rates are effective for the four summer demand months: June, July, August and September. The wholesale, as well as retail, electric rates are higher because Nebraska Public Power District (NPPD) charges NCPPD higher wholesale rates due to its higher costs during this time. It is NCPPD's goal to keep the summer electric peak demand down to prevent or lessen rate increases in the future.

NCPPD encourages customers to reduce their electric usage during these months between the hours of 9 a.m. to 11 p.m. If everyone does their part to reduce usage, hopefully electric rates can continue at an affordable level.
